


When: May 30-31, 2023

Objective: The 2023 Summit goal is to strengthen sustainable economic empowerment in our communities, families, businesses, and faith community.

Registration: \$300 per Church (up to 10 registrants) + applicable fee or \$50 per individual registration + applicable fee.

Registration will open March 2023.

Proceeds: Project HOPE (Helping Others Prepare for Excellence) Scholarship Funds. Our goal is to raise \$50,000 to support job training programs, start-up businesses and nonprofits, and entrepreneurs. Project HOPE will provide new beginnings and financial stability for present and future generations.



Summit Goal: Recognizing economic struggles on multiple levels facing our community, Summit's training tracks will explore and instruct participants on how to be more sustainable in every area of their lives: church, community, family, and self through collaboration and networking with the influencer's factors at all levels.

Training Tracks: The summit will be a learning-sharing environment and include training tracks focus around five (5) topic areas:

- **Pastoral Sustainability** (Pastoral care, support, sustenance, and well-being)
- <u>Church Sustainability</u> (Financial, Stakeholders Collaboration, Program Development, and Management)
- Community Sustainability (Financial, Economic Development Collaboration, Community Develop- ment, supporting small business, and growth)
- *Individual Sustainability* (Financial and Investment Literacy, Self-sufficiency, Insurance, Health, and Advanced Directives)
- *Family Sustainability* (Financial and Investment literacy, Self-sufficiency, Insurance, Debt Reduction, and Elder Care)

How: The hybrid Summit will be two (half-day) segments; four training modules; and four sessions per module daily for a total of twenty-four training sessions. In person participants will be at the Ninth Episcopal District headquarters in Birmingham Alabama. Virtual participants will be sent a ZOOM link once registered.

Benefits: It is projected that 1500+ individuals accumulatively will be in attendance on the virtual platform and in person. The Summit is designed to bring maximum and unlimited exposure of our sponsors to the attendees in either in-person and virtual settings.
