THE ROLE OF A STEWARD IN THE AME CHURCH

Stewards are appointed by the Pastor of each church, circuit, or mission for a one-year term. Each year, they are confirmed during the first Quarterly Conference. They can be reappointed for additional terms. The discipline states that the number of Stewards shall be no fewer than three or more than 19. The Pastor determines and nominates the number of Stewards during the first Quarterly Conference. The Pastor can appoint a Pro Tem to act in his/her absence to conduct all business of the church.

The Board of Stewards also must approve the members of the Board of Stewardesses. Stewards shall seek out the needy and distressed to relieve and comfort them. They shall register all baptisms, marriages, and deaths within the congregation. They shall provide the implements and elements for the Holy Communion.

QUALIFICATIONS TO BE A STEWARD

One must be of solid piety, know and love the word of God, the African Methodist Episcopal Church Doctrine, and the Discipline. The person must be fruitful and of good nature or have acquired the ability to transact the spiritual and temporal business of the church. The person must be a church member for at least 2 years, except for establishing a new congregation.

TOOLS OF THE TRADE

Each Steward should have a copy of the Doctrine and Discipline of the African Methodist Episcopal Church, the Holy Bible, and the Hymnal.


