The Role of the Trustee in the AME Church

Key responsibilities of an AME Church Trustee

THE TRUSTEES OF OUR CHURCH ARE ELECTED AND NOT APPOINTED!

- **Property management:** Hold deeds and titles to all church property, including buildings, land, and parsonages.
- **Maintenance and improvements:** Maintain and make repairs to church property and may make improvements when authorized by the congregation.
- **Pastor's housing:** Secure, furnish, and maintain a house for the pastor and his or her family.
- **Legal and administrative duties:** Act as the legal entity for the church, signing contracts and deeds when authorized by the congregation.
- **Financial stewardship:** Manage and account for church funds, invest trust funds properly, and ensure adequate insurance coverage for church property and personnel.
- **Strategic planning:** Plan for the future needs of the church over the long term.




